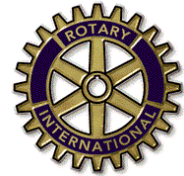

Silver Trowel—Roy Philbin

Joe had the pleasure of introducing guest speaker Mr Roy Philbin our very own Rotarian as well as lecturer and instructor at Silver Trowel Trade Training — a leading provider of quality education and training in the building and construction industry.

Roy spoke of their work and Silver Trowel's role as the preferred provider of training for the WA Master Roof Tilers Association. Silver Trowel currently delivers industry specific training to new entrants to the industry, apprenticeship training as well as specialised courses to up-skill people already working in the industry.

Silver Trowel offer a variety of construction skills training courses for bricklaying, solid plastering and roof tiling as well as trade apprenticeship training in bricklaying, roof tiling and solid plastering; traineeships in concreting and general construction.

Silver Trowel's two week intensive bricklaying skills course provides job placement assistance within the construction industry on successful completion of the course.

Originally specialising as a training centre for bricklaying, Silver Trowel became a registered training organisation in 2006 and has grown to include the trade areas of roof tiling, wall & floor tiling, solid plastering, carpentry and general construction so as to address the skills shortage in these industries.

Silver Trowel has developed Certificate and Diploma courses in Management to develop business management skills in the student having completed trade training.

Roy spoke of the day to day challenges he faces with students some of which have little interest other than satisfying the Centrelink requirements.
